#### ADARSH SMARAK SCHEME IN ANDHRA PRADESH

## 1100. SHRI SUBHAS CHANDRA BOSE PILL:

Will the Minister of CULTURE be pleased to state:

- (a) the progress in provision of facilities like cafeteria, Wi-fi, Braille signages, interpretation centre, illumination to Salihundam in Srikakulam, Nagarjunakonda in Guntur and Veerabhadra temple (Lepakshi) in Anantapur under Adarsh Smarak Scheme;
- (b) whether Government is contemplating to extend the scheme to 135 centrally protected monuments sites in Andhra Pradesh; and
- (c) If so, the details thereof, and if not, the reasons therefor?

### **ANSWER**

THE MINISTER OF CULTURE, TOURISM AND DEVELOPMENT OF NORTH EASTERN REGION (SHRI G. KISHAN REDDY)

(a) There is no Scheme called "Adarsh Smarak Scheme". However,100 Centrally protected monuments/site are identified as Adarsh Smarak for providing basic amenities as well as additional tourist facilities. The facilities provided/augumented are as under:
