INSUFFICIENT FUNDS RELEASED TO STATES UNDER MGNREGA

Will the Minister of RURAL DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that insufficient funds are being provided to States in MGNREGA head due to which MGNREGA labourers are getting less job opportunities;
- (b) the State-wise details of the funds released under MGNREGA during the last five years; and
- (c) whether Government is planning to increase the number of working days of MGNREGA in view of the increasing unemployment so that labourers can get work in their villages/localities?

ANSWER

(a): Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (Mahatma Gandhi NREGS) is a demand driven wage employment programme which provide for the enhancement of livelihood security of the households in rural areas of the country by providing at least one hundred days of guaranteed wage employment in every financial year to every household whose adult members volunteer to do unskilled manual work. In the current FY 2021-22 (as on 26.03.2022), 99.53% households are offered employment against their demand for work under Mahatma Gandhi NREGS.

Under Mahatma Gandhi NREGS, States submit funds release proposals to the Government of India. Fund release to the States is a continuous process and Central Government is committed to making funds available to States for the implementation of the Scheme. The Ministry releases funds periodically in two tranches with each tranche consisting of one or more installments, keeping in view the “agreed to” Labour Budget, demand for works, opening balance, pace of utilization of funds, pending liabilities, overall performance and subject to submission of relevant documents by the State.

(b): State/UT-wise details of fund released under Mahatma Gandhi NREGS in the last five financial years 2016-17, 2017-18, 2018-19, 2019-20, 2020-21 is given at **Annexure**.

(c): Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (Mahatma Gandhi NREGA) is to provide at least 100 days of guaranteed wage employment in a financial year to each household in rural areas of the country whose adult members volunteers to do unskilled manual work. In addition to this, there is a provision for upto additional 50 days of wage employment in a financial year in drought/natural calamity notified rural areas. As per Section 3 (4) of the Act, the State Governments may make provision for providing additional days of employment beyond the period guaranteed under the Act from their own funds.
