#### "DEATHS OF CHILDREN DUE TO MALNUTRITION"

#### 3189 SHRI NEERAJ DANGI:

Will the Minister of WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

- (a) the number of deaths due to malnutrition recorded during the last three years;
- (b) whether it is a fact that malnutrition causes many deaths of children in the country;
- (c) if so, the reasons therefor;
- (d) the details of financial assistance provided by Government to the States for tackling malnutrition; and
- (e) whether Government has taken any other remedial measures?

#### **ANSWER**

## MINISTER OF WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOMENT (SHRIMATI SMRITI ZUBIN IRANI)

- (a) to (c) Malnutrition is not a direct cause of death. No deaths due to malnutrition have been recorded by any State / UT and no such information has been provided by any State / UT. However, malnutrition may increase morbidity by reducing resistance to infections. Under Reproductive, Maternal, Newborn, Child, Adolescent Health (RMNCAH) strategy of National Health Mission (NHM), various activities are conducted across the country and these activities contribute in child survival as well as improvement in the nutritional status of children.
- (d) Details of financial assistance provided by Government to the States/UTs during their Annual Programme Implementation Plan (APIP) for implementation of RMNCAH strategy is placed at Annexure I. Under POSHAN Abhiyaan, the details of funds allocated to States/UTs in order to address malnutrition is at Annexure II.
- (e) (i) The Government has accorded high priority to the issue of malnutrition and is implementing several schemes like Anganwadi Services, Scheme for Adolescent Girls and Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana (PMMVY) under the Umbrella Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) Scheme as direct targeted interventions to address the problem of malnutrition in the country.

Further, POSHAN Abhiyaan launched on 8th March 2018, aims to reduce malnutrition in the country in a phased manner, through a lifecycle approach, by adopting a synergised and result oriented approach.

Mission Poshan 2.0, an integrated nutrition support programme has been announced in budget 2021-2022 for all States/UTs. It seeks to strengthen nutritional content, delivery, outreach and outcomes with focus on developing practices that nurture health, wellness and immunity to disease and malnutrition. Guidelines were issued for transparency and accountability in delivery of supplementary nutrition and to track nutritional outcomes on 13.01.2021.

(ii) Under NHM, there are 1080 Nutrition Rehabilitation Centres (NRCs) operational across the country. These NRCs provide medical and nutritional care of the admitted sick children with Severe Acute Malnutrition (SAM).
