#### CNG pumps set up in the country

Will the Minister of *Petroleum and Natural Gas* be pleased to state:

- (a) the total number of CNG pumps set up in the country, State-wise and district-wise details thereof;
- (b) whether Government has any proposal to set up new CNG filling stations in a number of States for making India pollution free;
- (c) if so, the details thereof, State-wise/District-wise including Tamil Nadu;
- (d)the number of stations proposed to be set up during the first phase and the time limit fixed for the same;
- (e) Whether Government proposes to set up such pumps, specifically near National Highways; and
- (f) if so, by when?

#### **ANSWER**

# MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF PETROLEUM AND NATURAL GAS (SHRI RAMESWAR TELI)

(a) to (f) At the end of 11<sup>th</sup> City Gas Distribution (CGD) bidding round, Petroleum and Natural Gas Regulatory Board (PNGRB) has issued authorization/Letters of Intent for 289 Geographical Areas (GAs) covering 88% of the area and 98% population of the country. The authorized entities have submitted a Minimum Work Programme (MWP) of setting up 16932 CNG stations across the length and breadth of the country over the period of next 8-10 years including 2547 in Tamil Nadu. State wise details of CNG stations including Tamil Nadu set up across the country as on 31.01.2022 and CNG stations to be set up as part of MWP after the 11<sup>th</sup> round are at Annexure. Location of CNG stations are decided by the authorized entities based on the demand and techno-commercial feasibility.
