WOMEN CENTRIC ENTERPRISES IN KARNATAKA

3671. SHRI IRANNA KADADI:

Will the Minister of MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES be pleased to state:

- (a) the programs and schemes of the Ministry for women owned and women centric enterprises in Karnataka and the details thereof;
- (b) the number of beneficiaries of the schemes in each State and Union Territory particularly in Karnataka, scheme wise;
- (c) the criteria for selecting such enterprises for the schemes and programs; and
- (d) the number of beneficiaries who were given the benefit of the schemes during the period of 2019-22 during lockdown restrictions of COVID-19?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE FOR MICRO, SMALL AND MEDIUM ENTERPRISES (SHRI BHANU PRATAP SINGH VERMA)

(a): The Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) implements many schemes for promotion and development of MSMEs (including women-owned MSMEs) in the country, including Karnataka. To encourage entrepreneurship among women, the Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) implements Mahila Coir Yojana under Coir Vikas Yojana, which is as an exclusive training programme aimed at skill development of women artisans engaged in the Coir industry. Two months stipendiary training in coir spinning is imparted through this programme.

The Ministry also implements Prime Minister's Employment Generation Programme (PMEGP), which is a major credit-linked subsidy programme aimed at generating self-employment opportunities through establishment of micro-enterprises in the non-farm sector by helping traditional artisans and rural/urban unemployed youth. For beneficiaries belonging to categories such as Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/OBC /minorities/women/ ex-serviceman/ physically handicapped/ NER/ Hill and Border areas, etc., higher subsidy is given. The trained artisans under Mahila Coir Yojana are encouraged to avail assistance through PMEGP scheme to set up coir units.

Through an amendment to the Public Procurement Policy, the Government has mandated that all Central Ministries/ Departments and Public Sector Undertakings should procure at least 3% of their annual procurement from women owned micro and small enterprises.

The Ministry also implements several other schemes for promotion and development of MSMEs, including women owned MSMEs, namely, Micro and Small Enterprises Cluster Development Programme (MSE-CDP), Tool Rooms & Technology Centres, Scheme of Fund for Regeneration of Traditional Industries (SFURTI), Procurement and marketing Support Scheme, Entrepreneurship and Skill Development Programme (ESDP), Credit Linked Capital Subsidy etc.

- (b): The State-wise number of beneficiaries of Mahila Coir Yojana and PMEGP in the country, including Karnataka, for the three years 2019-20, 2020-21 and 2021-22 is given in Annexure.
- (c): The selection of beneficiaries for these schemes is done as per the guidelines of the respective Scheme. The details of all schemes are available on the website https://msme.gov.in
- (d): The number of persons benefited through Mahila Coir Yojana, PMEGP and the Public Procurement Policy, during the years 2019-20, 2020-21 and 2021-22 is as follows:
