**CROSS BORDER INFILTRATION IN J&K**

**(a) whether the cross border infiltration has increased in Jammu & Kashmir (J&K) during the last three years;**

**(b) the details with respect to infiltration in J&K during the last five years; and**

**(c) what steps have been taken by Government to check cross border infiltration in J&K?**

**(a) & (b): The cross border infiltration has decreased significantly since 2018 in Jammu and Kashmir. The Estimated Net infiltration during last five years is as under:**

**(c): The Government has adopted a multi pronged approach to contain cross border infiltration. This includes multi-tiered deployment along the International Border/Line of Control, border fencing, improved intelligence and operational coordination, equipping security forces with advanced weapons and taking proactive action against infiltrators.**
