#### GUIDELINES FOR THE INOCULATION OF CHILDREN BELOW 18 YEARS

(a) & (b) Government of India has expanded the COVID-19 vaccination to beneficiaries aged 15-18 years from 3<sup>rd</sup> January 2022 and 12-14 years from 16<sup>th</sup> March 2022 on the recommendation of domain knowledge experts and has issued advisories in this regard to all States/UTs. As on 30<sup>th</sup> March 2022, against the estimated population of about 7.40 crore beneficiaries aged 15-18 years, a total of 5.70 crore (77%) have received atleast one dose, 3.77 crore (51%) beneficiaries have received 2<sup>nd</sup> dose of COVID vaccine.

As on 30<sup>th</sup> March 2022, against the estimated population of 4.7 crore beneficiaries aged 12-14 years, a total of 1.51 crore (32%) have received 1<sup>st</sup> dose of COVID-19 vaccine.
