SCHEMES FOR SPORTS AND YOUTH WELFARE

4157 LT.GEN. (DR.) D. P. VATS (RETD.): SHRI HARNATH SINGH YADAV:

Will the Minister of YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of schemes being run for the welfare of youth in the country;
- (b) whether Government has any special scheme regarding sports and youth welfare in the States of Haryana and Uttar Pradesh and if so, the details thereof;
- (c) the details of the scheme being run with regard to youth welfare at Panchayat levels in rural areas of the country; and
- (d) the details of the special schemes being run at district level for the welfare of youth in the country?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS

(SHRI ANURAG SINGH THAKUR)

(a) The details of the schemes being run for the welfare of the youths in the country by Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (through its Department of Youth Affairs and Department of Sports) are given below:

Department of Youth Affairs:

Department of Youth Affairs has three major schemes for development of youth in the country namely 1. Rashtriya Yuva Sashaktikaran Karyakram (RYSK) consisting of seven sub schemes namely (i) Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan (NYKS) (ii) National Youth Corps, (iii) National Programme for Youth & Adolescent Development, (iv)International Cooperation, (v) Youth Hostels, (vi) Assistance to Scouting & Guiding Organisations, (vii) National Young Leaders Programme. 2. National Service Scheme (NSS) and 3. Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD). The details of the schemes are placed at annexure.

Department of Sports:

"Sports" being a State subject, the responsibility of development of sports, including sanctioning adequate funds, planning strategies for improvement/development of youth and sports activities and constructions of youth hostels and stadiums, rests with the State/ Union Territories Governments. The Ministry of Youth Affair & Sports supplements their efforts in this regard by providing financial assistance for promotion of sports activities through National Sports Federations, training in Sports Authority of India (SAI) Centres, support under Khelo India Scheme.

- (b) The Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports runs its schemes for the development of Sports and Youth in the country as a whole including the state of Haryana and Uttar Pradesh.
- (c) and (d): All the schemes of the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports are implemented at pan-India level.

ANNEXURE REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PART (a) OF THE RAJYA SABHA UNSTARRED QUESTION NO. 4157 FOR 07.04.2022 ASKED BY LT.GEN. (DR.) D. P. VATS (RETD.) AND SHRI HARNATH SINGH YADAV REGARDING SCHEMES FOR SPORTS AND YOUTH WELFARE

Department of Youth Affairs:

1. Rashtriya Yuva Sashaktikaran Karyakram (RYSK): The Scheme has following seven sub-components:

Nehru Yuva Kendra Sangathan (NYKS): NYKS undertake Core Programmes under Annual Action Plan from Block Grant of Department of Youth Affairs and also implement Schemes viz. National Young Leaders Programme (NYLP), National Programme for Youth and Adolescent Development (NPYAD) and National Youth Corps (NYC) under RYSK Scheme of Department of Youth Affairs, Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports and undertakes various schemes of other Departments and Ministries.

National Young Leaders Programme (NYLP): Under National Young Leaders Programme (NYLP), Neighbourhood Youth Parliament Programmes are organized by involving NYKS-affiliated Youth Clubs with the objective of developing leadership qualities of the youth by involving them in debate/ discussions on contemporary issues. Youth for Development Programme is organized to develop leadership qualities of the youth by involving them in *Shramdaan* activities. Awards are given to youth clubs doing outstanding work.

National Youth Corps (NYC): The main objectives of the Scheme are to set up a group of disciplined & dedicated youth who have the inclination and spirit to engage in the task of nation-building and to facilitate the realization of inclusive growth (both social and economic).

Youth Hostel: Youth Hostels are built to promote youth travel and to enable the young people to experience the rich cultural heritage of the country. Presently, there are 83 Youth Hostels in the country.

National Programme for Youth and Adolescent Development (NPYAD): Under NPYAD Schemes financial assistance is provided to Government/non-Government organisations for taking up youth and adolescent activities viz. Youth Development and Personality development training, Promotion of National Integration, Promotion of Adventure. Besides these, financial assistance is provided for National Youth Festival, National Youth Award, Tenzing Norgay National Adventure Award etc.

International Co-operation (IC): Under International Co-operation (IC) Programme the Department endeavours to create an international perspective among youth in collaboration with the countries and international agencies/organisations on various youth issues.

Assistance to Scouting & Guiding Organisations: Under Scouting & Guiding component the Department provides financial assistance to Scouting & Guiding Organisations with a view to promote the Scouts and Guides movement in the country. This is an international movement aimed at building character, confidence, idealism and spirit of patriotism and service among young boys and girls.

- 2. National Service Scheme (NSS): This is a Central Sector Scheme under the Department with the objective of developing the personality and character of the student youth through voluntary community service. The scheme is run through various universities, colleges and institutions. Under NSS Scheme the student are enrolled as volunteers for two years to undertake different community development activities, under Regular Activities for 240 hours i.e. 120 hours in each year. Apart from Regular Activities, these volunteers are also required to attend one Special Camp of 7 days' duration, which is conducted in the adopted village/slum of the respective NSS unit. On completion of 240 hours of Regular Activities and attending One Special Camp, the NSS volunteer is given a Certificate.
- **3. Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD)**: Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development (RGNIYD), Sriperumbudur, Tamil Nadu, is an 'Institute of National Importance' under the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports, Government of India, by virtue of enactment of RGNIYD Act, 2012.

The Institute functions as a think-tank of the Ministry and premier organization of youth-related activities in the country. As the apex institute at the national level, it works in close cooperation with the NSS, NYKS and other youth organizations in the country. It has a wide network with various organizations working for the welfare and development of young people and also serves as a mentor.
