Regulating ed-tech sector

Will the Minister of Education be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government is aware about the monopolist and exploitative practices of some companies in ed-tech sector;
- (b) if so, the details thereof and steps taken to tackle this issue;
- (c) whether Government plans collaboration with the companies in this sector to improve educational standards of our country and to better the penetration of educational apparatus in rural India; and
- (d) if so, the details thereof?

ANSWER MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (DR. SUBHAS SARKAR)

- (a) & (b) In order to safeguard against the exploitative practices of ed-tech companies, the Government has issued advisory which includes do's and don'ts for the stakeholder. It has also reiterated legal provisions for e-commerce firms for information to citizens who are of ed-tech services. UGC and AICTE have also issued public notices advising the students to check the recognition /entitlement status of the programme on official website before enrolling for any course.
