Illegal mining of forest land in Digboi Forest Division

196 SHRI A. D. SINGH:

Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

- (a) details of forest land in the Digboi Forest Division that has been illegally mined by North Eastern Coalfields without requisite approval;
- (b) measures Government is taking to restore the said forest cover; and
- (c) measures Government is taking to safeguard wildlife particularly elephants in the Dehing
 - Patkai Elephant Reserve which is the largest rain-forest spread over 937 Sq. Kms.?

ANSWER

(a) & (b) Protection and management of forests is primarily the responsibility of concerned State/UT. The various actions to check illegal mining are taken by the State Govt. as per the provisions under various Acts, Rules, Guidelines and orders of Hon'ble Courts.

As per information received from the Government of Assam,73.20 hectare of forest land has been illegally mined by the North Eastern Coalfields, Coal India Limited (NECF, CIL).

State Govt has further informed that the said illegal coal mining has already been stopped. TheNECF, CIL has been penalized for theillegal coal mining activity and a demand note of rupees ₹43,24,85,798/- for Penal Compensatory Afforestation and other levies has been sent to NECF, CIL by the State Govt. Further, the Bio-diversity Management Plan,Regional Wildlife Plan and Carrying Capacity Study has been prepared by the Rain ForestResearch InstituteJorhat. The total cost of implementation of this plan is₹62.5 crore.

(c) As informed by the Govt. of Assam, the DihingPatkai Wildlife Sanctuary has been upgraded to DehingPatkai NationalPark. Routine patrolling duties are being performed on regular basis in and around theReserve Forests/DihingPatkai National Park keeping liason with the District Civil & Police administration as and when required including in notified elephant corridors. Moreover, the Biodiversity Management Plan, Regional-Wildlife Plan and Carrying Capacity Study have been prepared by the Rain Forest Research Institute, Jorhat, forsafeguarding the wildlife particularly Elephants in DehingPatkai Elephant Reserve.
