- (a) the details of funds allotted and utilised under the National Health Mission (NHM) since its inception, State-wise including Tamil Nadu;
- (b) whether Government has taken or proposes to take any steps to allocate more funds to strengthen NHM and make it more effective;
- (c) if so, the details thereof;
- (d) the details of Community Health Centres (CHCs) and Public Health Centres (PHCs) established under NHM since its inception, State-wise including Tamil Nadu; and
- (e) the steps taken by Government to assess the implementation and progress of NHM along with its present status?

(a) to (e):

The details of funds released and utilized under the National Health Mission (NHM) since its inception, State-wise including Tamil Nadu is at Annexure-I.

The Government has continued to allocate more funds to strengthen the National Health Mission (NHM). Allocation under NHM has increased from Rs.27,989 crore in 2020-21 to Rs.31,100 crore in 2021-22 Budget Estimate.

The details of Community Health Centres (CHCs) and Public Health Centres (PHCs) established under NHM, State-wise including Tamil Nadu is at Annexure-II.

Public health and hospitals is State subject, hence the primary responsibility for proper implementation of the scheme lies with the State/UT Governments. However, under NHM, regular interactions are held with States/UTs. Various mechanisms exist to assess the implementation and progress of NHM like:

- Review of key deliverables of Record of Proceedings of previous financial year during the NPCC meetings,
- Annual visits to States by Common Review Mission which inter-alia, looks at financial systems and mechanisms.
- Implementation of Public Financial Management System for monitoring and management of funds.
- Regular monitoring visits by senior officials of the Ministry.

Further, Government of India also reviews /assesses the implementation of NHM through external surveys such as, National Family Health Survey, District Level Household Survey, Annual Health Survey and Sample Registration System.

The present status of progress under NHM is placed at Annexure-III.
