(c) and (d) National Policy on Education, 1986, as modified in 1992, inter-alia, provides that "Corporal punishment will be firmly exceeded from the educational system". Corporal punishment is strictly prohibited in schools run by Kendriya Vidyalaya Sangathan, Navodaya Vidyalaya Samiti and Central Tibetan School Administration, which are under the Ministry of Human Resource Development. Education being a concurrent subject, States follow their own policy in respect of schools under the purview of the State Governments.
