Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

- (a) the cost-wise details of the works carried out in Dausa, Alwar, Sawai Madhopur and Karauli districts of the State of Rajasthan under Green India Mission during the last three years;
- (b) the details of agencies or non-governmental organizations (NGOs) through which the said works have been carried out;
- (c) whether training equipments have been provided to unemployed youth under the Mission; and
- (d) if so, the details of such unemployed youths in Dausa, Alwar, Sawai Madhopur and Karauli districts of Rajasthan who have been provided with training equipments under the Mission and the cost of these equipments?

(a) to (d) National Mission for a Green India (GIM) is one of the eight missions outlined under the National Action Plan on Climate Change. It aims at protecting, restoring and enhancing India's forest cover and responding to climate change. The Ministry has not received any Plan from the State Government of Rajasthan under Green India Mission. However, under the support component, training programs on various livelihood activities like Bangle Making, Dairy Farming, Vermi Composting, Sewing, Tailoring, Poultry farming, etc. has been conducted for the local communities in the implementing States under GIM.
