**INTEGRATED CHECK POSTS AT INTERNATIONAL LAND BORDERS**

**(a) & (b): The Government of India has set up Integrated Check Posts at international land borders of the country with the aim to facilitate cross-border trade and movement of passengers. Presently, 09 Integrated Check Posts are operational at various land borders. The details of these Integrated Check Posts are at Annexure – A.**

**(c): After establishment of these Integrated Check Posts, the trade volume and movement of passengers has increased.**
