#### COCKROACH AND RAT MENACE IN THE TRAINS

### 1588 # SHRI VINAY DINU TENDULKAR:

Will the Minister of RAILWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether cockroaches and rats found in the trains are damaging the baggage of the passengers and also causing harm to the health of the passengers;
- (b) the name of the department that is going to be assigned the responsibility to fix this problem;
- (c) by when action would be taken to ensure safe travel of the passengers; and
- (d) the details of the action taken in this regard?

#### **ANSWER**

# MINISTER OF RAILWAYS, COMMUNICATIONS AND ELECTRONICS & INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY (SHRI ASHWINI VAISHNAW)

- (a) and (b) Railway's Mechanical Department oversees the work of Pest and Rodent control in coaches mainly through outsourcing contracts. Penalties are imposed upon contractors on detection of deficiencies.
- (c) and (d) Following steps have been taken to eliminate this problem and to ensure safe travel of passengers:
- (i) Contracts for regular Pests and Rodent control in coaches have been awarded to professional agencies. This includes:
  - All AC, Non AC reserved and un-reserved coaches including pantry cars.

Rat pads are being provided in coaches to control the rodents.

- In addition to coaches, Rodent Control is being done in pit lines, maintenance yards and Railway stations to have full control.
- Glue boards are also available with train escorting staff for en-route requirement, if arises.
- Fumigation of coaches.
- (ii) Regular monitoring is being done vigilantly by Railway Staff for proper execution of the contracts.
- (iii) Surprise inspections are carried out to ensure proper performance by the contractors and penalties are levied on detection of deficiencies.
- (iv) In case of passenger complaints, the coaches are again given pest & rodent control treatment.
