Literacy status in Telangana

1952 Dr. K. Laxman:

Will the Minister of *Education* be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of support provided by Central Government to the State Government of Telangana under the Samagra Shiksha scheme in the last three years;
- (b) whether fund provided by Central Government was completely utilized by the State Government in the last three years, if so, the details thereof;
- (c) whether there is a huge gender divide of literacy rate in Telangana among five States in the country with lowest literacy rate;
- (d) if so, any action plan shared by the State Government to curb the gender literacy divide in Telangana, the details thereof; and
- (e) district-wise data for enrolment of girls in schools in Telangana?

ANSWER

MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (SHRIMATI ANNPURNA DEVI)

(a) & (b): The Department of School Education and Literacy has launched the Samagra Shiksha - an Integrated Scheme for School Education, throughout the country as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme with effect from Financial Year 2018-19. It is an overarching programme for the school education sector extending from pre-school to class XII and aims to ensure inclusive and equitable quality education at all levels of school education. It envisages the 'school' as a continuum from pre-school, primary, upper primary, secondary to senior secondary levels. The States/UTs are assisted by the Central Government to implement the Samagra Shiksha as a programme for providing universal access and retention, bridging the gender and social category gaps in education and enhancement of learning level of children at all levels of school education. The details of support provided by Central Government to the State Government of Telangana under the Samagra Shiksha scheme and its utilization in the last three years are as under:

(c): Government of India has approved a new Centrally Sponsored Scheme, namely, "New India Literacy Programme (NILP)" with the aim to support the States and Union Territories in promoting literacy among non-literates in the age group of 15 and above, across the country covering 5 crore non-literates during the implementation period from 2022-27. The scheme has been approved with a financial outlay of Rs.1037.90 crore including Central share of Rs.700.00 crore and State share of Rs.337.90 crore.

The literacy data in the country is collected through decennial census operation conducted by Registrar General of India. The last Census was held in 2011. As per the Census 2011, the adult literacy rate (in the age group 15 and above) in the country was 69.28 percent (Adult Male literacy rate was 78.84 per cent and female literacy rate was 59.26 per cent). The State of Telangana was created on 2nd June, 2014 and since then no fresh Census data has officially been released by the Registrar General of India. As such the official data of literacy rate in Telangana is not available.

(d): To address the gender gap in school education, Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas (KGBVs) have been sanctioned in Educationally Backward Blocks (EBBs) in Telangana. KGBVs are residential schools from class VI to XII for girls belonging to disadvantaged groups such as SC, ST, OBC, Minority and Below Poverty Line (BPL).

Provision has been made to upgrade the existing KGBVs at upper primary level to senior secondary level. The scheme aims to provide access and quality education to girls from disadvantaged groups by setting up residential schools from upper primary to senior secondary level and to ensure smooth transition of girls from elementary to secondary and up to class XII wherever possible.

Total 738 KGBVs have been sanctioned (20 under Type I, 280 under Type II, 195 under Type III and 243 under Type IV). Out of 738 KGBVs, 696 KGBVs are functional with 124701 girls' enrolment against 136500 targeted girls' enrolment.

Out of the 124701 girls enrolment, 31988 are SC (25.65%), 29517 are ST (23.67%), 59806 are OBC (47.96%), 1400 are Muslims (1.12%) and 1990 are BPL category (1.60%).
