SUICIDE CASES REPORTED AMONG POLICE PERSONNEL

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

(a) the number of suicide cases reported among police personnel during last five years, year-wise, State-wise, details thereof;

(b) whether Government has conducted any study on workload among the police personnel, if so, details thereof; and

(c) if not, the reasons therefor?

(a): Since 'Police' and 'Public Order' are State subjects as per the Seventh Schedule of the Constitution of India and welfare of the police personnel is primarily, the responsibility of the State Governments, the details related to the number of suicide cases reported among State police personnel are not maintained centrally.

State/Union Territory-wise and year-wise details of the number of suicide cases reported amongst Central Armed Police Forces (CAPF), Assam Rifles & National Security Guard personnel during the period of five years from 2017 to 2021 are at Annexure.

(b) and (c): The Bureau of Police Research and Development (BPR&D) had conducted a research study titled “National requirement of Manpower for 8-Hour Shifts in Police Stations” through Administrative Staff College of India (ASCI), Hyderabad in the month of December, 2014. The BPR&D had also undertaken a research study on “Comparative Analysis of Attrition and Suicide Cases in CAPFs and Corrective Measures” through the Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA) in September, 2020.
