ATROCITIES AGAINST SC AND ST

Will the Minister of SOCIAL JUSTICE AND EMPOWERMENT be pleased to state:-

(a) Whether there has been a consistent rise in the number of cases filed under the provisions of the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989; and

(b) if so, the details thereof and the steps taken by Government to prevent atrocities and hate crimes against the Scheduled Castes (SCs) and Scheduled Tribes (STs)?

(a) & (b) As per the report of the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB), Ministry of Home Affairs, the atrocity cases registered under the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 in the year 2018, 2019 and 2020* are as under:

Year	Cases registered
2018	49064
2019	53515
2020	58538

(* The latest published data pertains to the year 2020)

Since 'Police' and 'Public Order' are State subjects under the Seventh Schedule (List-II) to the Constitution of India, the responsibility of maintaining Law and Order, Protection of life and property of the citizens including SCs/STs rests with the respective State Governments/Union Territory Administrations and the States are competent to deal with such offences under the extant provision of Law.

However, Government of India issues advisories to the State Governments/UT Administrations from time to time for effective implementation of the PoA Act and Rules made thereunder.

Further, National Helpline against Atrocities (NHAA) on the members of Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes has been also launched by the Department of Social Justice & Empowerment. The objective of the helpline is to generate awareness about the provisions of the Law that are aimed at ending discrimination and provide protection.
