Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT, FOREST AND CLIMATE CHANGE be pleased to state:

- (a) details of the works carried out in the State of Maharashtra under the Green India Mission during the last two years, cost-wise;
- (b) details of the agencies or Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs) through which the said works have been carried out;
- (c) whether training equipments are provided to the unemployed youths under the said Mission;
- (d) if so, the details of the unemployed people in Maharashtra who have been given training equipments under the said mission along with the cost of the training equipments?

- (a) to (d) National Mission for a Green India (GIM) is one of the eight missions outlined under the National Action Plan on Climate Change. It aims at protecting, restoring and enhancing India's forest cover and responding to climate change. The Ministry has released an amount of Rs 10.30 Crore during the FY 2018-19 to carry out the GIM activities through Joint Forest Management Committees, over an area of 5223.40 ha in the state of Maharashtra. Under the support component, training programs on various livelihood activities like Bee keeping, Organic farming, Sericulture, Local Handicraft, Mushroom cultivation, Bangle Making, Dairy Farming, Vermi Composting, Sewing, Tailoring, Poultry farming, etc. have been conducted for the local communities in the implementing States under GIM.
