that this House recommends to Rajya Sabha that Rajya Sabha do join the said Joint Committee and communicate to this House the names of the Members to be appointed by Rajya Sabha to the Joint Committee."

#### **Need for special package to protect coffee growers**

SHRI JAGGESH (Karnataka): Sir, in the coffee heartland of Karnataka comprising Kodagu, Chikkamagaluru and Hassan districts, coffee planters have suffered badly due to destruction caused by heavy rain between July and September of last monsoon season. The impact of rain continues with diseases affecting plants and estate infrastructure suffering long-term damages. Unpredictable weather conditions are helping pests to breed and new diseases to emerge. Drastic changes in climate patterns over the last few years have adversely impacted India's coffee production and the quality of crop. Fruit rot, stalk rot, root rot and other damage to crop has been done due to heavy rainfall and landslides. Most growers fear that such climatic patterns could wipe out plantations. The production of crop for the year 2022 is estimated to be some 35 per cent lower and has impact on export. Moreover, the

unsettled market prices and the cost of financing is one of the biggest challenges of the coffee sector with banks insisting growers to provide collateral for financing, high rates of interest and growers unable to repay loans resulting in outstanding of lakhs of short-term and long-term loan accounts. The accounts of many coffee growers have turned to non-performing assets and the growers are now facing banks recovery proceedings.

Under these conditions, I urge the Government to take immediate steps to exclude coffee plantations from recovery proceeding under the provisions of the Act and to restructure outstanding loans and a special package in line with the special coffee term loan. Thank you, Sir.

**Impending delay in the construction of new National Highway from Prayagraj (Uttar Pradesh) to Singrauli (Madhya Pradesh) via Mirzapur**
