(b) With a view to upgrade the skills of retiring Personnel Below Officer Rank (PBOR) and Ex-Servicemen (ESM) of Armed Forces a large number of quality job oriented courses are conducted by Training Directorate of Directorate General of Resettlement (DGR). The details of ESMs trained during the last three years in various rehabilitation courses are as under:—

Besides this there is 10% reservation for the post of Astt. Commandant in Para Military Forces and 100% reservation in Defence Security Corps for ESM. The ESM have 10% to 14% reservation in CRPF, SSB, Delhi Police and Railways.

The DGR also runs various Self Employment Schemes for the ESM namely, Allotment of Army Surplus Vehicles, Coal Transport Scheme, Coal Tipper Scheme, Allotment of Oil Product Agencies, Mother Dairy Milk, Fruit & Vegetable Booth, Management of CNG stations in National Capital Region (NCR), Allotment of GHAR Outlets and Kidzee Franchisee.

(c) and (d) Various States have reservation for ESM in State Police Forces varying from 10-14%. Recruitment to the civil police being a State subject, actual details of intake against the aforesaid reservation are not maintained at present. However, as per information available State Government of Bihar recently recruited approximately 5000 ESM in Special Auxiliary Police.
