**ASPIRATIONAL DISTRICT PROGRAMMES IN PUNJAB**

1425 SHRI VIKRAMJIT SINGH SAHNEY:

Will the Minister of PLANNING be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government is planning to add more districts from Punjab in Aspirational District Programme (ADP);
- (b) if so, the details thereof, if not, the reasons therefor;
- (c) the details of activities that are intended to be undertaken in next one year in districts of Punjab where Aspirational Districts Programme is implemented;
- (d) the details of activities which have been undertaken after the implementation of ADP, district-wise for Punjab; and
- (e) the details of funds released and allocated for the same?

**ANSWER**

- (a) and (b) No sir, at present, there is no proposal to include more districts under the Programme. On basis of selected indicators, two districts from Punjab namely Ferozepur and Moga were identified as districts with low progress in socio-economic indicators. The programme pays a focussed attention to the most backward districts in the State.
- (c) and (d) The programme aims at rapid transformation of underdeveloped districts across sectors which are critical for improving quality of life or economic productivity of citizens. These sectors are Health and Nutrition, School Education and Basic Infrastructure, and also Agriculture and Water Resources and Financial Inclusion & Skill Development. 49 key performance indicators have been selected across these sectors and a district's performance is monitored on the basis of progress made on these indicators on a monthly basis which is available in the public domain on the Champions of Change Dashboard (<http://championsofchange.gov.in/site/coc-home/>).

The architecture of the Aspirational Districts Programme is in the nature of additionality. It ensures that development activities under the existing schemes of Central and the State

Governments are implemented efficiently to make improvement in the key performance indicators. To incentivise performance in the districts, the program envisages provision of additional allocation. Every month, districts are assessed on the basis of monthly progress and the best performing Districts in overall terms and in each of the five sectors are identified. The first and second rankers in overall terms are awarded ₹10 crores and ₹5 crores respectively. The first ranker from each of the five sectors is awarded ₹3 crores each. Districts use this reward money to undertake projects as per their special needs. The projects proposed by Ferozepur and Moga are under various stages of implementation. The list of various projects undertaken by the districts of Punjab are given in Annexure I.
