CONVERSION OF NHs INTO FOUR LANES AND SIX LANES

1687 SHRI KAMAKHYA PRASAD TASA:

Will the Minister of ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the targets set for conversion of National Highways (NHs) into four and six lanes have been achieved during the last one year in Assam;
- (b) if so, the details thereof including the total length of NHs targeted to be converted into four lanes and six lanes during the last one year in Assam;
- (c) the total length of NHs that have actually been converted into four and six lanes during the said period; and
- (d) the details of funds earmarked/allocated/spent for the said purpose during the said period?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS (SHRI NITIN JAIRAM GADKARI)

- (a) to (c) The Ministry sets targets for construction of National Highways (NHs) on linear length basis and not on lane-km basis. However, development of NHs to 4-lane, 6-lane etc., are monitored. During previous financial year 2021-22, 90.79 km NHs have been developed to 4-lane standard in the State of Assam.
- (d) Allocation of fund is made State-wise and not NH-wise or project-wise. However, it may be mentioned that during previous financial year 2021-22, Rs.1272.83 crore has been spent on projects involving 4-laning in the State of Assam.
