#### **MONITORING OF OTT PLATFORMS**

#### \*27. SHRI VIKRAMJIT SINGH SAHNEY:

Will the Minister of INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government proposes to draft any policy to ensure that no identity, religious and regional sentiments should get hurt by the content on OTT platforms in India;
- (b) if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the details of the existing policy in this context to reduce vulgarity on these platforms?

### **ANSWER**

THE MINISTER OF INFORMATION AND BROADCASTING; AND MINISTER OF YOUTH AFFAIRS AND SPORTS (SHRI ANURAG SINGH THAKUR):

(a) to (c): A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (a) to (c) OF RAJYA SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO \*27 FOR ANSWER ON 08.12.2022

(a) to (c): The Government has notified Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021 on 25th February, 2021 under Information Technology Act, 2000, which inter alia requires OTT platforms to adhere to a Code of Ethics laid down in the Rules. The Code provides for general principles to be followed by OTT platforms, including that a publisher shall take into consideration India's multi-religious context and exercise due caution and discretion when featuring the activities, beliefs, practices or view of any religious group. The Code also requires OTT players not to transmit any content which is prohibited by law and undertake age based self-classification of content, based on general guidelines provided in the Schedule to the Rules.

The Rules also provide for a three-tier grievance redressal mechanism to look into grievances/ complaints relating to violation of the Code of Ethics by the OTT platforms.

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
