plan to be implemented by the urban local bodies and private sedtor participation in providing basic services such as water supply, solid waste management, parks and garden, public conveniences, roads and flyovers; and

(c) the other steps Government proposes to take in improving the housing shortage?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOUSING AND URBAN POVERTY ALLEVIATION (KUMARI SELJA): (a) A Technical Group on Estimation of Urban Housing Shortage was constituted by the Central Government. The Group estimated a housing shortage of 24.71 million dwelling units at the end of the Tenth Five Year Plan. The Technical Group has estimated the total Housing shortage during the entire Eleventh Five Year Plan as 26.53 million dwelling units.

(b) The Government has launched the Jawaharlal Nehru National Urban Renewal Mission (JNNURM) to assist cthes and towns in taking up housing and infrastructural facilthes for the urban poor in 63 cthes in the country under the Basic Services to the Urban Poor (BSUP) Programme. Other cthes/towns are covered under Integrated Housing and Slum Development Programme (IHSDP). Both BSUP and IHSDP are under implementation since December, 2005. On completion of the Mission period of seven year, it is expected that all urban poor will be able to have access to a basic level of urban services. Provision of basic services to urban poor including security of tenure at affordable prices, improved housing, water supply, sanitation and ensuring delivery of other already existing universal services of the Government for education, health and social security is a mandatory reform under BSUP and IHSDP schemes. Public Private Partnership is also a recognized optional reform under these schemes.

(c) Apart from schemes of BSUP and IHSDP under JNNURM, an amount of Rs. 30 crores has been allocated in the budget for 2007-08 for an interest subsidy scheme for provision of housing to the Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)/Low Income Group (LIG) of the society.
