Will the Minister of **TOURISM** be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government has revamped Swadesh Darshan scheme as SW 2.0 to develop sustainable and responsible tourism destinations;
- (b) the details of difference between SW 1.0 and SW 2.0;
- (c) the details of State perspective plans submitted by the State Government of Karnataka; and
- (d) the details of destinations so far approved and status of the same?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF TOURISM

(SHRI G. KISHAN REDDY)

(a) to (d): Yes, Sir. The Ministry of Tourism has revamped the Swadesh Darshan scheme as Swadesh Darshan 2.0 (SD2.0). Under Swadesh Darshan 1.0, the projects were sanctioned under identified thematic circuits whereas objective of Swadesh Darshan 2.0 is to develop responsible and sustainable tourism destinations following a tourist and destination centric approach.

The State Government of Karnataka has submitted its State Perspective Plan (SPP) giving details in respect of State Tourism profile, policy environment, details regarding product development and partnership with private sector, tourism statistics etc. The Ministry of Tourism has identified 48 destinations in 27 States/UT including Karnataka for development under SD2.0; the details of which is annexed.
