PROVISION OF EQUIPMENTS IN ICUS OF VARIOUS HOSPITALS IN JHARKHAND

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) the provision of equipments for intensive care of patients and intensive care units (ICU) in various hospitals in the State of Jharkhand, the details thereof;
- (b) the plan to provide such facilities in these hospitals in the State of Jharkhand, the details thereof; and
- (c) if not, the reasons therefor?

(a) to (c): Under National Health Mission (NHM), the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare provides financial and technical support to States/UTs to strengthen their health care systems including setting-up/upgrading public health facilities and augmenting health human resource on contractual basis for provision of equitable, affordable healthcare to all its citizens based on requirements posed by the States in their Programme Implementation Plans (PIPs).

Under NHM, Rs. 267.78 lakhs is approved for High-Dependency Care Units (HDU), Special Newborn Care Unit (SNCU) & Newborn Stabilization Unit (NBSU) in Record of Proceedings (RoPs) for 2022-24.

Under Emergency COVID Response Package (ECRP II), Rs. 8088.00 Lakhs is approved for ICU beds in public healthcare facilities in Jharkhand including 20% paediatric ICU beds.

Under the CSS components of the **PM-Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission** (PM-ABHIM) scheme, provision has been made for establishment of 602 Critical Care Hospital Blocks (CCBs) to enable the public healthcare system at the district level to respond adequately during the public health challenges posed by future pandemics and in periods of epidemic outbreaks and enable the health systems to also maintain the essential health services in such times.

The 100 and 50-bedded Critical Care Hospital Block/Wings would be self-contained, and be equipped with critical, supportive and ancillary services such as Emergency area, Intensive Care Units (ICU), Isolation Wards/Oxygen supported beds, Surgical unit, etc.

As per operational guidelines of PM-ABHIM, the unit cost of 100 Bedded CCB in District Hospital, is Rs.4450 lakhs and for 50 bedded CCBs in District hospital & 50 bedded CCBs in Govt Medical Colleges is Rs. 2375 lakhs.

For the State of Jharkhand, provision has been made for total 22 nos Critical care blocks (CCBs), out of which 21 CCBs have been approved with the cost of Rs. 51,950 lakhs.
