NARCOTICS AND PSYCHOTROPIC SUBSTANCE-RELATED ISSUES

**385. SHRI MUZIBULLA KHAN:

Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the quantity and types of narcotics seized by the Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) in Odisha during the last three years;**
- (b) the details of narcotics and psychotropic substance-related arrests made in all States in the last year, State-wise;**
- (c) the details of funds released by Union Government under its Central Financial Assistance Scheme to States to strengthen their enforcement capabilities for combating the illicit trafficking of narcotics and psychotropic substances and dealing with the supply side of the drug menace still in operation State-wise; and**
- (d) the measures taken by Government to reduce illegal trade of narcotics and drug trafficking in the country?**

- (a) The quantity and types of Narcotic Drugs & Psychotropic Substances seized by Narcotics Control Bureau (NCB) in Odisha during last three years is as under:-**

- (b) **The details of arrests made in all states in the year 2022 under Narcotics Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) cases as reported by the various Drug Law Enforcement Agencies to NCB is at Annexure- A.**
- (c) **The details of funds released under the Scheme Assistance to States/ UTs for Narcotic control during the year 2018-19 to 2022-23 is at Annexure-B.**
- (d) **The steps taken by the Government to reduce drug trafficking in the country are detailed below:-**
- (i) **The Government has introduced the NCORD mechanism in 2016 to have effective coordination of actions among various Ministries, Departments, Central and States Law Enforcement Agencies dealing with narcotics. The mechanism was restructured in 2019 into a 4 tier structure as detailed under:-**
- **Apex Level Committee (headed by Union Home Secretary)**
 - **Executive Level Committee (headed by Special Secretary (IS), MHA).**
 - **State Level Committee (headed by Chief Secretary of the concerned State).**
 - **District Level Committee (headed by District Magistrate)**

NCORD mechanism has been further strengthened by addition of new members at different levels to make it more effective and comprehensive.

- (ii) An NCORD portal has been developed which is an all in one portal for information related to drug law enforcement. Topics like NCORD, Training & Capacity Building, Narco-Offenders data, legal information, exemplary initiatives taken by States etc. are covered on the NCORD portal.**
- (iii) To monitor the investigation of significant and important drug cases including cases of narco-terrorism, a Joint Coordination Committee (JCC) with DG, NCB as its Chairman has been set up by Govt. of India on 19 July 2019.**
- (iv) A Special Task Force on Darknet and Crypto Currency has been constituted to monitor suspicious transactions related to drugs on Darknet.**
- (v) Dedicated Anti-Narcotics Task Force (ANTF) headed by ADG/IG level Police Officer has been established in each State/UT.**
- (vi) To prevent drug trafficking along land and sea border areas various border guarding forces like BSF, SSB, Assam Rifles and Indian Coast Guard have been empowered under Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act, 1985 to make interdiction of drugs.**
- (vii) To prevent Inter-State movement of narcotic drugs across the country by railway network, the Railway Protection Force (RPF) has also been empowered under NDPS Act, 1985 for search, seizure and arrest.**
- (viii) The Government has approved cadre restructuring of NCB with creation of 425 new posts at different levels in 2022 & 2023. Creation of 04 new Regional Offices at Amritsar, Guwahati, Chennai and Ahmedabad and 05 new Zonal Offices at Gorakhpur,**

Siliguri, Agartala, Itanagar & Raipur and upgradation of 12 Sub-zonal Units to Zonal Units to increase NCB's Pan India presence has also been approved.

- (ix) A high level dedicated group Multi Agency Maritime Security Group (MAMSG) has been created in National Security Council Secretariat (NSCS) to analyze the drug trafficking through maritime routes, challenges and solutions.**
- (x) NCB in association with Interoperable Criminal Justice System (ICJS) has created a portal called National Integrated Database About arrested NDPS Offenders (NIDAAN).**
- (xi) With a view to bring uniformity in DLE training across India, NCB in collaboration with Department of Revenue, MoSJ&E, NACIN, BPR&D and CAPT Bhopal has developed a core module and five training modules for different ranks of DLEA, CAPFs, SPP and other civil departments. Training programmes on Digital Forensics, Darknet and Crypto currency are being organized.**
- (xii) Nar-K9 pool - a national Canine Pool has been established at 10 locations as a national resource to serve the interests of NCB Zonal Units as well as cater to the requirements of the States and other Central agencies.**
