UDAN SCHEME

Will the Minister of CIVIL AVIATION be pleased to state:-

- (a) the total number of routes awarded by Government under the UDAN (Ude Desh Ka Aam Nagrik) scheme till now;**
- (b) the State/UT-wise details thereof;**
- (c) the benefits realised as a result of the same;**
- (d) the challenges faced in the operationalisation and sustenance of the said flight routes; and**
- (e) the proposed routes under the said scheme?**

ANSWER

Minister of State in the Ministry of CIVIL AVIATION (Shri Murlidhar Mohol)

(a) & (b): Under Regional Connectivity Scheme - Ude Desh Ka Aam Nagrik (RCS-UDAN), 870 valid routes have been allotted to various Selected Airline Operators, out of which 579 routes , connecting 85 unserved/ underserved airports , including 13 Heliports and 2 Water Aerodromes, in various States/UTs have been operationalised. The details, State/UT-wise, are attached at Annexure

(c): Since its inception in 2017, UDAN has expanded air travel, making it accessible to millions of Indians. UDAN has bridged the gap for connectivity by improving unserved air routes in underserved regions of the country and fulfilling the aspirations of the common citizens, driving economic growth and development in these areas. Following are various other benefits realised by the Scheme so far.

-142 lakhs Passengers have flown in over 2.74 lakhs RCS flights

-NER connectivity received a boost from the scheme with 74 valid Fixed wing and Helicopter routes connecting 12 Airports/Heliports having been operationalised in NER.

-The UDAN scheme has encouraged procurement of different type of aircraft in the country, ranging from 3 seater Tecnam, 9 seater Cessna 208B, 19 seater Twin Otter, 50 seater Embraer 145, 42/72/78 seater ATR and Q-400 to bigger aircraft like 189 seater Airbus 320/321 and B737 for UDAN flights.

-13 Airlines have commenced operations under UDAN including start-ups. UDAN scheme has been the cradle for birth of new Airlines like AirTaxi, IndiaOne, Star Air, FlyBig and Fly91.

-UDAN has triggered air connectivity and regional growth for many airports, which are now serving non-RCS Commercial flights too, like Belgaum, Kadapa, Hubballi, Salem, Darbhanga, Jharsuguda.

-UDAN scheme has sparked a massive increase in helicopter services in hilly areas. 60 Helicopter Routes have been operationalised under the UDAN scheme so far.

(d): Some of the challenges faced in operationalisation and sustenance of the routes under the Scheme are

1. Delay in airport development due to land unavailability,

2. Technical and operational constraints at certain airports,

3. Delay in obtaining Scheduled Commuter Operators Permit by new entrant Airlines,

4. Other issues such as non-availability of suitable aircraft, aircraft leasing issues, maintenance issues of small aircraft, low passenger load factor on certain routes etc.

(e) 291 valid awarded routes are proposed to be commenced under the scheme. UDAN is an ongoing scheme wherein bidding rounds are conducted from time to time for covering more destinations and routes under the scheme.
