1581 DR. ASHOK KUMAR MITTAL:

Will the Minister of PLANNING be pleased to state:

- (a) whether Government has succeeded in transforming all the selected aspirational districts of the country as per the aspirational districts scheme;
- (b) if so, the details of all aspirational districts in the country;
- (c) the fund released to each aspirational district of the country, district-wise;
- (d) whether it is a fact that some blocks of the country have been declared as aspirational blocks by Government;
- (e) whether development programmes have been started in these blocks and if so, the details thereof; and
- (f) the details of the number of aspirational blocks given to private companies for development, State-wise?

ANSWER

- (a) The Aspirational Districts Programme aims to accelerate the socio-economic development of 112 relatively under-developed districts. The broad strategy of the programme rests on the 3 Cs – Convergence (between Central and State Schemes), Collaboration (between Centre, State, District Administration, Development Partners and Citizens) and Competition (between Districts). The programme focuses on 49 indicators across sectors of health and nutrition, education, agriculture and water resources, financial inclusion and skill development, and basic infrastructure. Every month, districts register their progress achieved in these indicators and are ranked on the basis of their performance. This has helped the Aspirational Districts to achieve significant improvement since the inception of the Programme. Details of district-wise performance (overall and theme-wise) since

inception for aspirational districts is available on the Champions of Change Portal (<http://championsofchange.gov.in/site/coc-home/>) which is in the public domain.

- (b) There are 112 Aspirational Districts in the country across 26 states and 1 Union Territory. The list of all Aspirational Districts in the country is given as Annexure I.
- (c) The basic strategy of the Aspirational Districts Programme is the convergence of existing Central and State government schemes. Additionally, under ADP, districts undertake various developmental projects to address the critical gaps using the award money they win through the programme's delta ranking method. The details of funds sanctioned under ADP to all Aspirational Districts are given as Annexure II.
- (d) The Government of India launched the Aspirational Blocks Programme (ABP) in January 2023, covering 500 blocks across 329 districts in 27 states and 4 UTs.
- (e) Yes sir, development programmes have been initiated in these blocks under the ABP and the details are available on the ABP Champions of Change Portal (<https://abp.championsofchange.gov.in/>).
- (f) None of the Aspirational Blocks have been given to private companies for development.
