**MISSION SHAKTI FOR WOMEN EMPOWERMENT**

1024. SHRI MADAN RATHORE:

Will the Minister of Women and Child Development be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the 'Mission Shakti' scheme has been implemented for women's empowerment in various States of the country, if so, the State-wise details thereof;
- (b) the date of implementation of this scheme in Rajasthan and the amount provided during the last three years, year-wise and district-wise details thereof; and
- (c) the district-wise details of the One Stop Centre (OSC) and women helpline under this scheme in the State of Rajasthan?

(a) & (b) Government of India has launched 'Mission Shakti' – an integrated women empowerment programme as umbrella scheme for the safety, security and empowerment of women for implementation during the 15th Finance Commission period 2021-22 to 2025-26 across the country including the State of Rajasthan. The grants-in-aid to the States/UTs are released to the Single Nodal Agency Account maintained by the State Implementing Department. The details of year-wise funds released under Mission Shakti scheme to State of Rajasthan during the last three years are as under:

(c) In the State of Rajasthan, 37 OSCs are operational in the 33 districts with one additional OSC each in the Districts of Alwar, Jaipur, Jodhpur and Kota. The district-wise details of One Stop Centre (OSC) are placed at annexure. Facility of Women Helpline is operational across the whole State of Rajasthan.
