VACANCIES OF TEACHING AND NON-TEACHING STAFFS

1796 SHRI NEERAJ SHEKHAR:

Will the Minister of Education be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of budget allocated for financial year 2024-25 for filling up of vacancies of teaching and non-teaching staffs in Central Universities of the country, University-wise;
- (b) the details of present in position strength of teaching and non-teaching staffs against the total sanctioned posts, as on date, University-wise;
- (c) the details of vacancies of teaching and non-teaching staffs advertised and filled up during 2023-24 on permanent basis, University-wise; and
- (d) the number of vacancies for which recruitment process is still going on, University-wise?

(a) to (d) During the year 2024-25, a total amount of Rs.15928 crore has been allocated to Central Universities (CUs) under “Grants to Central Universities”. Salaries of teaching and non-teaching staffs are met out of this provision only. As on 01.07.2024, there are 13858 teaching and 18748 non-teaching positions filled in Central Universities, running in regular mode, under purview of Ministry of Education. Through special recruitment drive more than 9650 positions (teaching and non-teaching) have been filled.

Central Universities under the Ministry of Education are statutory autonomous organizations established under respective Central Acts of Parliament and governed by provisions of the Acts/Statutes/Ordinances/Regulations made thereunder. Occurring of vacancies and filling thereof is a continuous process. The vacancies arise due to retirement, resignation and additional requirements on account of enhanced students’ strength; the onus of filling up the posts lies on the Central Universities (CUs). Ministry of Education and University Grants Commission (UGC) regularly monitor the institutions and the Central Universities have been directed to fill up the vacancies on permanent basis.
