# 1802 DR. K. LAXMAN: SHRI CHUNNILAL GARASIYA:

Will the Minister of **EDUCATION** be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of the steps taken by Government to digitally empower the girl students of Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas;
- (b) whether Government proposes to give special priority to the girl students of Tribal Sub-Plan (TSP) area as declared in Schedule-V, in this Scheme, if so, the details thereof; and
- (c) the details of girl students who have benefitted from Kasturba Gandhi Vidyalayas, State/Union Territory-wise?

#### ANSWER

# MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EDUCATION (SHRI JAYANT CHAUDHARY)

(a) to (c): Kasturba Gandhi Balika Vidyalayas (KGBVs) are residential schools from class VI to XII, set up in Educationally Backward Blocks for girls belonging to disadvantaged groups such as SC, ST, OBC, Minority and Below Poverty Line (BPL) under Samagra Shiksha Scheme.

Under Information & Communication Technology (ICT) Component of "Samagra Shiksha" Scheme, financial assistance is provided to States/UTs for establishing Smart Classrooms and ICT labs in KGBVs as in other schools. It aims to provide basic infrastructure to the students and transform the classroom into tech-driven class. The students increase engagement with multimedia content and interactive activities, while availing wider range of resources. This fosters deeper understanding, collaboration, and digital literacy for students, enriching their overall educational experience. At present, ICT labs and Smart classrooms are available in 1500 KGBVs and 2880 KGBVs respectively.

Further, States/UTs have been requested to saturate all the functional KGBVs with ICT labs and Smart classrooms and Central Government provides support as per the norms prescribed under Samagra Shiksha Scheme for this purpose.

Girls belonging to Scheduled Tribe (ST) are one of the core/priority beneficiaries of KGBVs. The State/Union Territory-wise number of girls enrolled in KGBVs is enclosed at Annexure.
