SUPPORT TO TEXTILE HUBS IN ODISHA

*130. DR. SASMIT PATRA:

Will the Minister of TEXTILES be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of existing textile hubs in Odisha, along with the number of people employed in each hub, district-wise;
- (b) the revenue generated by these hubs in the last three years, including export revenues;
- (c) whether Odisha is one of the leading hubs for handloom weavers, if so, the initiatives undertaken to support them;
- (d) whether Government plans to develop more textile hubs in Odisha and across the country, if so, the details thereof; and
- (e) the steps taken to provide an export-oriented boost to the textile sector in Odisha?

ANSWER

THE MINISTER OF TEXTILES (SHRI GIRIRAJ SINGH)

(a) to (e): A statement is laid on the Table of the House.

STATEMENT REFERRED TO IN REPLY TO PARTS (A) TO (E) OF THE RAJYA SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. *130 DUE FOR ANSWER ON 6.12.2024 RAISED BY DR. SASMIT PATRA REGARDING SUPPORT TO TEXTILE HUBS IN ODISHA.

- (a): A number of textile activities including handloom, powerloom etc. are carried out in various districts of Odisha. The details of people employed in handloom and powerloom sectors district-wise are at Annexure A & B respectively.
- **(b):** Segment-wise details of Export of textile products for the last three years from 2021-22 to 2023-24 and the current year 2024-25 (up to September) by Odisha at Annexure C.

However, information on district -wise revenue generated is not maintained.

(c): Over 68,000 households comprising over 1.25 lakh weavers are engaged in various handloom activities in Odisha. Ministry of Textiles is implementing a number of schemes/initiatives to promote handlooms and welfare of handloom weavers across the country, including Odisha.

Two such major schemes are National Handloom Development Programme and Raw Material Supply Scheme. Under these schemes, financial assistance is provided to eligible handloom agencies/weavers for raw materials, procurement of upgraded looms & accessories, solar lighting units, construction of workshed, training and skill upgradation under SAMARTH, product & design development, technical and common infrastructure, marketing support for handloom products in domestic/overseas markets, concessional loans under weavers' MUDRA scheme and social security etc.

Under the above schemes, Government has taken a number of initiatives to promote the handloom workers in Odisha. 34 Handloom Clusters provided financial assistance, 6,488 weavers provided improved looms/accessories under Hathkargha Samvardhan Sahayata, 5,392 handloom workers imparted Skill up-gradation training, Workshed provided to 109 Weavers & Lighting units to 1,021 weavers, 7,654 beneficiaries provided loans under Weavers' MUDRA Scheme, 71,442 beneficiaries enrolled under PMJJY/PMSBY, 66,146 beneficiaries enrolled under Mahatma Gandhi Bunkar BimaYojana/converged MGBBY, 64 marketing events organised to facilitate and promote sales of Handloom Products, to enhance productivity, marketing capabilities and facilitate better incomes, 9 Handloom Producer companies have been formed, under National Handloom Development Programme in Odisha from 2014-15 to 2024-25 (as on 31.10.2024), 37 yarn depots and 02 warehouses are functioning in the State, 76.59 lakh kg of yarn supplied under transport subsidy & price subsidy components of Raw Material Supply Scheme in Odisha from 2014-15 to 2024-25 (as on 31.10.2024).

Apart from the above, the Government of Odisha is also implementing the Mukhyamantri Bayan Jyoti Yojana, Bunakar Assistance for Livelihood and Income Augmentation (BALIA), 10% one Time Rebate on sale of Handloom Cloth and Promotion of Handloom Industries (POHI) to support Handloom Weavers.

(d) & (e): The Handlooms, Textiles and Handicrafts Department, Government of Odisha has formulated the Odisha Apparel and Technical Textiles Policy 2022 (OATTP-2022). The focus of the Policy is to encourage the textile activities in the state.

In addition, the Ministry of Textiles is implementing a number of schemes to strengthen the Textile Value Chain across the country. These include PM Mega Integrated Textile Region and Apparel (PM MITRA) Parks, Scheme for Integrated Textile Parks, Integrated Processing Development Scheme, Comprehensive Powerloom Mega Cluster Development Scheme, SAMARTH (Scheme for Capacity Building in Textile Sector), Silk Samagra, National Handloom Development Programme, National Handicraft Development Programme, Integrated Wool Development Programme, National Technical Textile Mission, Production Linked Incentive scheme, etc.
