(a) to (d): No, Sir. However, the unserviceable released parts of the bridges namely steel girder etc. are disposed off as scrap to realize the value for released material.

In some cases, the abandoned railway bridges are handed over to concern state government for the purpose of using it for tourism purpose etc. on the request of state government, as done in the case of Godavari bridge (Havelock bridge) in Andhra Pradesh and Curzon bridge in Uttar Pradesh.
