Will the Minister of PORTS, SHIPPING AND WATERWAYS be pleased to state:

- (a) the updated data on the number of ports and stakeholders currently utilizing the National Safety in Ports Committee (NSPC) application on the National Single Window System;
- (b) whether there have been measurable improvements in regulatory compliance and cost reductions for stakeholders since the application's launch, along with any reported challenges or feedback from users; and
- (c) whether the Ministry has plans for additional digital initiatives in 2024 aimed at further streamlining operations and enhancing safety and efficiency in ports?

- (a) to (c) The online application of the Navigational Safety in Ports Committee (NSPC) through the National Single Window System beta version has been tested by various ports and the inputs and suggestions received from the users have been incorporated into the system. The Major Ports are also undertaking digital initiative, such as National Logistics Portal (Marine), Sagarmanthan Portal, Vessel Tracking Management System, e-office and Sparrow. Additionally, regular infrastructure and cyber security audits are being conducted to improve efficiency, transparency and safety, thereby transforming the operation of Major Ports.
