- (a) the details of the steps taken towards improving the National Career Service Portal with the aim of empowering the youth of rural and semi-urban areas to acquire digital skills; and**

(a) & (b) Improvement of the National Career Service (NCS) Portal is a continuous and dynamic process and is based on suggestions and requirements of stakeholders. The steps taken to improve the portal include integration with Government portals such as Udhyam, e-Shram, Skill India portal, EPFO, ESIC, MHRD, DigiLocker and employment portals of various States. NCS also has linkages with Government recruitment bodies like Union Public Service Commission, Staff Selection Commission, Agricultural Scientists Recruitment Board, Railway Recruitment Boards etc. for making available scores of non-recommended candidates to other employers to enable them to identify employable candidates. The Ministry has signed MoUs with various private job portals for synergizing the vacancies on the NCS Portal. The Ministry has also approved establishment of 407 Model Career Centres (MCCs) in various districts to provide career-related services to jobseekers and employers. In the international sphere, NCS facilitates Ministry of External Affairs approved Recruiting Agents (RAs) to post international job opportunities on it to expose domestic jobseekers to global job opportunities.
