INCENTIVES/SUBSIDIES TO FARMERS TO ADOPT BIO-PESTICIDES

*375. SHRI MOKARIYA RAMBHAI:

Will the Minister of AGRICULTURE AND FARMERS WELFARE be pleased to state:-

(a) whether Government is planning to provide incentives or subsidies to farmers who adopt sustainable options such as bio-pesticides and Integrated Pest management (IPM); and

(b) if so, the details thereof?

STATEMENT IN RESPECT OF PARTS (a) & (b) OF THE RAJYA SABHA STARRED QUESTION NO. 375 FOR 04/04/2025 RAISED BY SHRI MOKARIYA RAMBHAI REGARDING INCENTIVES/ SUBSIDIES TO FARMERS TO ADOPT BIO-PESTICIDES.

(a) & (b): Department of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare (DA&FW) through its Central Integrated Pest Management Centre (CIPMC), Krishi Vigyan Kendras (KVK) and State Agriculture Department promote use of Bio-pesticides and Integrated Pest Management (IPM) practices by farmers across the country which encompasses cultural, mechanical and biological methods of pest control and use of chemical pesticides as a last resort. DA&FW through its Central Integrated Pest Management Centers (CIPMCs) undertakes various training programs namely Farmers Field Schools (FFS), Human Resource Development (HRD) programs, and judicious use of pesticide awareness campaigns to educate and train farmers for use of bio-pesticides, bio-control agents and botanical formulations as an alternative to chemical pesticides for pest management. During these training programmes, upgradation of skill of farmers is being undertaken on Agro Eco System Analysis (AESA) based decision making to protect crops by integrating all IPM techniques for timely decision on pest management approach. Further, farmers are also advised to use CIB&RC approved pesticides with recommended dosage on the crops as and when required, and to treat the seeds with bio-pesticides/ chemical pesticides before sowing to avoid seed borne disease for healthy crops. CIPMCs are also promoting use of bio-control agents during the survey of crops and field release of bio-control agents. The details of Farmers Field School, HRD programs and Pesticide awareness campaigns conducted by CIPMCs during 2019-20 to 2024-25 is enclosed at **Annexure-I**.

Further, Government is promoting organic farming through Paramparagat Krishi Vikas Yojana (PKVY) in all the States/UTs except NE States, and Mission Organic Value Chain Development for North Eastern Region (MOVCDNER) with the objective to provide end-to-end support to farmers engaged in organic farming i.e. from production to processing, certification and marketing and post-harvest management. The primary focus of the schemes is to form organic clusters in a cluster where preference is given to small and marginal farmers to help them to create a supply chain.

Under PKVY, States/UTs are provided financial assistance of Rs. 31,500/ha over 3 years in the organic clusters out of which, Rs. 15,000/ha is provided directly to farmers through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) for on-farm inputs like composting, green manuring etc. and off-farm inputs like organic seeds, manures, vermicomposts, biofertilizers, biopesticides, neem formulations, phosphorous rich organic manure (PROM), waste decomposer, botanical and physical and biological plant protection agents etc..

Under MOVCDNER, assistance of Rs. 46,500/ha over 3 years is provided for creation of Farmers Producer Organization(FPOs), support to farmers for organic inputs etc. Out of this, assistance at the rate of Rs. 32,500/ ha is provided to farmers for off farm (like as neem oil, cakes, bio-fertilizers, waste decomposers, etc.) and on farm (like vermicompost beds) organic inputs including Rs. 15,000 as DBT to the farmers. Farmers can avail maximum 2ha area under both the schemes.
