**CENTRAL FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO STATES IN HEALTH SECTOR  
DEVELOPMENT**

**921. SHRI SANDOSH KUMAR P:**

Will the Minister of **HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE** be pleased to state:

- (a) the criteria for central financial assistance for health sector development in the States;
- (b) the central assistance towards health sector development extended to each State during the last three years; and
- (c) whether Government is planning to increase financial assistance towards the States for health sector development?

**ANSWER

(a) to (c): Under National Health Mission (NHM) and Pradhan Mantri Ayushman Bharat Health Infrastructure Mission (PM ABHIM), technical and financial support is provided to the States/UTs for strengthening the healthcare systems, based on the proposals received from the States/UTs in their Annual Programme Implementation Plan (PIP) and subject to the Resource Envelope (RE). The resource envelope of a State/UT under NHM and PM ABHIM, is based on its population and a weight-age factor, which depends on area of the State, health lag/socio-economic backwardness. Based on the proposals received from the States in their Programme Implementation Plan (PIP), approvals are provided keeping in view of the resource envelope of the States/UTs as well as existing norms.

Release of funds under NHM and PM ABHIM is subject to the compliance of the guidelines by States/UTs, prescribed in this regard by Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance. As per Department of Expenditure, Ministry of Finance D.O. No. 32/PSO/FS/2015 dated 28<sup>th</sup> October, 2015 the funding will be shared 60:40 between the Centre and the State (90:10 for the 8 North-

Eastern and 3 Himalayan States) under NHM. States/UTs wise Central Release under NHM and PM ABHIM from FY 2021-22 to 2023-24 is given at Annexure-I and II respectively.

Further, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare through various Centrally Sponsored Schemes supplements the efforts of the States / UTs in the healthcare sector. The various Centrally Sponsored Schemes are implemented with separate budget lines for each component of the schemes under this Ministry. Government spending for these schemes are made for best output as per quarterly expenditure plan. The funds are released on the basis of Utilization Certificate to the States/UTs. There is a robust system in place for monitoring various schemes implemented through the States / UTs. Reviews are conducted for ensuring and facilitating the speedy implementation of the schemes by way of addressing various administrative, technical and financial issues. The details of various major Centrally Sponsored Schemes / Programme implemented through the States/UTs along-with details of funds released are mentioned below:

- i. Establishment of New Medical Colleges attached with existing District/Referral hospitals at Annexure-III
- ii. Up gradation of existing State Government/Central Government medical colleges to increase MBBS seats in the country and Strengthening and up gradation of State Government Medical colleges for starting new PG disciplines and increasing PG seats at Annexure-IV
- iii. Augmenting Nursing Education at Annexure-V
- iv. Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB PM-JAY) at Annexure-VI
- v. Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana (PMSSY) at Annexure-VII
