## Satellite based tele-medicine facilities

1300. DR. K. KASTURIRANGAN: Will the Minister of HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the satellite based telemedicine facilities set up in certain interior and remote parts of the country are effectively reaching super speciality health care to the poor and needy people;
- (b) whether Government have plans to expand such telemedicine networks in the country; and

(c) if so, the details thereof?

THE MINISTER OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE (SHRIMATI SUSHMA SWARAJ): (a) to (c) Yes, Sir. Some pilot projects have been undertaken by Department of Information Technology to set up Telemedicine facilities in different parts of the country. Under the pilot project Cancer/NET in Kerala about 4,207 cancer patients and under the Telemedicine Project on the Development of Telemedicine for Tropical Diseases in West Bengal about 1000 patients have undergone teleconsultation. As of now 34 Remote/District/Medical College/Mobile hospitals are connected to 12 super speciality hospitals located in major cities. The Department of Space have also taken up telemedicine pilot project as a proof of concept technology demonstration in various States of India like Jammu and Kashmir, Orissa, North Eastern Region, Lakshadweep Islands, Andaman & Nicobar Islands, Kerala, Karnataka etc. The expansion of the network is to be addressed by the respective State Governments; the Central Government will provide necessary assistance to those State Governments towards establishing operational network for meeting the need of the people in remote areas.
