

Yamuna Action plan

SHRI P. PRABHAKAR REDDY:

Will the Minister of ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that a ten-year clean up operation was launched in 1993 for cleaning the Yamuna river;

(b) if so, the details thereof;

(c) the progress made so far for controlling the level of pollution in the river;

(d) what is the present level of pollution;

(e) the reasons for tardy progress in this direction; and

(f) steps proposed to be taken to achieve the targets of the Yamuna Action Plan (Phase-I) to clean the river which has been virtually reduced to a big sewage drain?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS (SHRI DILIP SINGH JUDEV): (a) to (f) Yamuna Action Plan-I (YAP-I) was launched in 1993 for cleaning of river Yamuna in the three States of Delhi, UP and Haryana covering 15 towns with JBIC funding. The project has been completed in February, 2003. The total expenditure incurred on the project is Rs. 668 crore : Haryana - Rs. 218 crore, UP - Rs. 270 crore and Delhi - Rs. 180, crore. The main works covered under YAP Phase-I are interception and diversion of sewage, construction of sewage treatment plants, community toilet complexes (low cost sanitation) and crematoria. A treatment capacity of 734 million litre per day (mld) has been created of which 401 mld is in UP, 303 mld in Haryana and 30 mld in Delhi.

The main reasons of pollution of river due to Delhi stretch are as follows:

- Shortfall of about 950 mld sewage treatment capacity,
- Siltation and settlement of about 91 km. of trunk sewers,

- Lack of dilution capacity in the river downstream of Wazirabad barrage, .
- Discharge of waste water from unsewered areas and slums, situated on the banks of the river and major drains, directly into the river.

In addition to various other measures being undertaken by State Governments, Yamuna Action Plan-II (YAP-II) has been approved at a cost of Rs. 624 crore for implementation in the three States of UP, Haryana and Delhi with JBIC funding. The main components to be implemented under the project are:

Delhi	—	STP (135 mld capacity new and 324 mld capacity rehabilitation)
	—	Rehabilitation/replacement of trunk seweres (30.82 kms.)
UP	—	STP (38 mld capacity new)
	—	Sewer lines (73 kms.)
	—	Rising Main (12.7 kms.)
Haryana	—	Sewer lines (73 kms.) and improvements in efficiencies of existing STPs.
