- (b) whether they have given any memorandum to the Chairman of the Board in this regard; and

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DR. VALLABHBHAI RAMJIBHAI KATHIRIA): (a) and (b) Yes, Sir. The Board has received certain representations from 'Janvadi Lekhak Sangh' with regard to removal of Munshi Premchand's novel 'Nirmala' in class 12th by Central Board of Secondary Education.

(c) The Board has provided an alternative to 'Nirmala' by Munshi Premchand with 'Jyon Mehandi Ko Rang' by Mridula Sinha in Hindi Elective of class 12th for the examination of March, 2004. The students will have an option to choose from out of the two novels.

For March, 2005 examination, the Board has introduced 'Rangbhoomi' by Munshi Premchand in place of 'Nirmala as its alternative Jyon Mehandi Ko Rang'. The students will have an option to choose from out of the two novels.
