

(b) No assessment is available about the number of cultivators having been affected by drought particularly in view of the fact that revival of monsoon in August resulted in late sowing of paddy and other crops in many areas.

(c) and (d) In order to compensate the farmers for the losses suffered in unirrigated areas and the additional expenditure incurred in irrigated areas, the Government announced Special Drought Relief Price ranging from Rs. 5 to Rs. 20 per quintal over and above the Minimum Support Prices announced for kharif crops of 2002-03.

As regards the alternative crops, States have been requested to take measures aimed at making seeds of alternative crops available to farmers at the appropriate time. The States have also been asked to take steps aimed at facilitating the timely flow of institutional credit to the farmers.
