**Demand for setting up of pre-cyclone warning system in coastal
area of Orissa**

MS. PRAMILA BOHIDAR (Orissa): Sir, Government is fully aware that the coastal area of Orissa is the most vulnerable and prone to cyclones. The 1999 super cyclone had played havoc with the State. Flood and cyclones do not come suddenly. They do give some warning. The cyclones can be monitored and warning issued in advance to the residents of the coastal areas, to minimise loss of life and property, as is the position in USA and China, who give some advance warning. Orissa is the poorest, backward, illiterate and cash-starved State. They neither have the wherewithal nor the resources for developing a pre-warning system or other infrastructure facilities. The State is wholly at the mercy of the Centre or international agencies for financial, material and other related help. Though belated, I would like to make a humble request to the Centre, that they should immediately get in touch with the State authorities, formulate short and long-term plans and set up a pre-cyclone-warning machinery and other related Infrastructure facilities in the coastal areas of the State, at the earliest. Any kind of slackness or delay now may cost us very heavily, which we may not be able to recoup or recover at a later date.
