(b) if so, what are the details in this regard and Government's reaction thereto?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI): (a) and (b) As per Government of Karnataka, no project proposal has been sent to the central Government for release of funds for providing cooked meals to the children belonging to Scheduled Castes under the National Programme of Nutritional Support to Primary Education (Mid-day Meal Scheme).

In a recent letter to the Prime Minister, the Chief Minister of Karnataka has requested for formulation of a scheme for 100% Central assistance to help implement the orders of the Hon'ble Supreme Court passed in WP(C) 196/2001 dated 28.11.2001.

The Government has already conveyed to the States/UTs that under the scheme the cost of conversion of foodgrains into a cooked meal is to be borne by the States Implementing Agencies.

#### **Vacant Post of Vice-Chancellor**

(a) whether it is a fact that as many as eleven Central Universities have been working without Vice-Chancellor for over a year now;

(b) if so, the details thereof and since when the post of Vice-Chancellor has been lying vacant in each University; and

(c) what are the reasons for delay in the above mentioned appointments and by when these are likely to be filled-up?

THE MINISTER OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DR. MURLI MANOHAR JOSHI): (a) No, Sir. As on date on post of Vice-Chancellor in any of the Central Universities is vacant.
