This scheme came to a close on 31-3-2001. A major

portion of the NFE Scheme was run by the State Governments which set up NFE centres. One component of this scheme provided grants to Voluntary Agencies or Non-Governmental Organisation direct from the Central Government for running Non-Formal Education centres.
