

Construction of Mughal Road

3595. MIRZA ABDUL RASHID: Will the Minister of ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that Prime Minister's economic package, among other things, included construction of Mughal Road between Rajouri and Kashmir as the alternate highway connection in the valley with the rest of country;

(b) whether this also a related reality that the State and Central Governments are to share the expenditure on 50 : 50 ratio to accomplish to task; and

(c) if so, whether the work on the said highway has begun as the commitment of the Prime Minister is time bound, supposed to be completed within three years?

THE MINISTER OF STATE OF THE MINISTRY OF ROAD TRANSPORT AND HIGHWAYS [MAJ. GEN. (RETD.) B. C. KHANDURI]: (a) Yes, Sir.

(b) Yes, Sir. This was agreed in principle.

(c) The feasibility study, detailed project preparation etc. are being carried out by the Government of J&K. It is too early to indicate any time frame for implementation of this project at this stage.

(d) whether Government think that the existing law is not deterrent enough to prevent such incidents or the procedure for issuing licenses is too liberal?
