(a) An amount of Rs. 242.00 lakhs has been sanctioned to Government of Assam for development of North East Tourist Circuit. This includes an amount of Rs. 30.00 lakhs for River Front Development along Brahmaputra and Rs. 45.00 lakhs for development of Ethnic Village of Bhalukpung.

(b) Rural tourism project has been sanctioned only at Phumen Ingti for Rs. 46.83 lakhs.
