Harassment of Indian lady

- 5051. SHRIVUAY J DARDA: Will the Minister of EXTERNAL AFFAIRS be pleased to state :
- (a) whether Government are aware of a harrowing tale of racial abuse perpetrated in US when an Indian-bom female Canadian was harassed at Chicago Airport, was forced back to India in Kuwaiti Airlines after her passport was mutilated by INS officials, and ultimately she had to get emergency passport at Kuwait after three days, thereby causing avoidable mental torture: and
- (b) if so. what steps Government propose to take with the US Government to avoid recurrence of such incidents?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF EXTERNAL AFFAIRS (SHRI VINOD KHANNA): (a) Government is aware that a Canadian lady of Indian origin was subjected to harassment at Chicago Airport by officials of the Immigration and natural zation Service of the United States Government. The reason for the alleged harassment was. according to her, because of the fact that she looked Indian but held a Canadian passport and bore a Spanish name.

(b) Since the victim is a Canadian national, under international law. it is the primary responsibility of the Government of Canada to seek rcdressal from the Government of USA. It is learnt that the victim herself has petitioned the Canadian Prime Minister in this regard.
