Publication of NCERT Books

5189. SHRI SHAHID SIDDIQUI:

SHRI UDAY PRATAP SINGH:

Will the Minister of HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT be pleased to state:

(a) whether the NCERT published its books for the current academic year in Hindi, Urdu and English;

(b) if so, the number of books which have been published in Urdu;

(c) whether it is a fact that last year NCERT books were not published in Urdu; and

(d) whether it is also a fact that NCERT is giving step motherly treatment to Urdu language?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT (DR. VALLABHBHAI RAMJI BHAI KATHIRIA): (a) to (d) As reported by NCERT all text books in English based on new syllabus have been released for classes I to XI and upto the 3rd semester for class XII. The translated version in Hindi for all classes would be made available by the time the schools reopen after the vacation.

As per the current practice the translation of text books in Urdu is to be done by National Council for Promotion for Urdu Language (NCPUL). The modalities for getting the new books translated in Urdu are being worked out on priority basis.

Welfare of Divorcees

Hence, it is not considered expedient to launch any special scheme for divorcees.
